THE GAME OF BASEBALL

Very briefly-the game consists of each team batting and fielding in turn to make one innings. Each team having nine players with substitutes being used throughout the Match. An innings ends when the fielding side dismiss three batsmen and then batting themselves.

The object of the game is for the batter to hit the ball in fair territory and become a basorumer, then the batter attempts to hit the ball so that the runner can advance round the bases and so score a run. The fielding sides objective is to stop or catch the batted ball and throw to the bases, thus putting the runner out. The pitcher trys to throw the ball across the home plate at a height between the knees and shoulders of the batter without him hitting it. If he succeeds it is one strike. The batter has three strikes and is out, if the ball goes astray of the strike zone four times, the batsman receives a walk to first base.

To-day's commentator will describe the game as it progresses and will cover any point not covered in this very brief description of Baseball.
