## A BRIEF EXPLANATION OF BASEBALL

A game consists of nine innings for each team (youth game seven), extra innings being played if the scores are level after nine. An innings ends when three men of the batting side are out.

A strike is a ball that passes over the home plate between the batters knees and ammpits.

A ball is called when a pitched ball is outside the former described area.

After three strikes the batter is out, but if the pitcher throws four balls, the batter walks to first base.

A fair hit is one that settles or flies over fair ground, le inside the foul lines. Outside these lines is a foul ball.

A batter becomes a baserunner when a fair hit is made or when given a walk.

A baserunner is out if the ball is held on first base before he reaches it. At second and third and home plate the runner must be touched with the ball held by the fielder, except when the runner is forced to advance.

On a catch the baserunner cannot advance from the base he occupies until after the catch is made.

You will find Baseball easy to follow and we are sure you will enjoy our sport. The whole point of the game is to make a circuit of the bases before three men are out.

Substitutes are allowed but once taken out of the game a player cannot be brought back on. The pitching distance is 60°6° distance between bases is 90°. (Youth level is 53' and 75' respectively). The weight of the ball is 5.25 ozs made from yarn, wound very tightly and covered with horsehide.
