PLAYER PROFILES

Alan Bloomfield, a former Arsenal schoolboy football player, took up baseball when he was nine years old. Now, as well as the Tigers, he plays for the Sutton Braves in BBF South Division 1, and is a Great Britain International. He has also spent a winter playing for a team in Australia. Alan plays mainly infield, short stop or 2nd base, but also plays catcher and pitcher.

Joe Walker, the Tigers catcher, hails from New York and has 25 years playing experience in Britain. He has played for the Golders Green Sox, the Waltham Abbey Arrows and the Barnestormers, and is in his first season with the Tigers. He soon hopes to publish a British Baseball magazine.

<u>Paul Collins</u> is a British/Canadian who has been playing baseball for 16 years. He has played in Canada, Saudi Arabia and also for a number of teams in the USA. He plays infield and catcher, and in the BBF South, is a member of the Croydon Bluejays.

Matt Abbott took up baseball nine years ago. He has played in Holland and for Great Britain in France. In the BBF South, he previously played for the Barnestormers and is now a member of the Sutton Braves. He can play either infield or outfield.

SOUTHERN TIGERS - cont/d

Michael "Pee-Wee" Quinn, outfielder, is an American who has been playing baseball for 20 years. He is currently the Tigers team coach. He also plays for the Croydon Bluejays and for a softball team.

<u>Keith Wilesmith</u>, a South African, is Team Manager and pitches or plays infield. He also plays for the Croydon Bluejays.

<u>Satvinder Singh Bhandal</u> claims to be the only British Sikh baseball player. He has been playing for 7 years and plays outfield for the Tigers. He also previously played for Hounslow and is in the Croydon Bluejays team.

<u>Paul-Simon Bullock</u> has been playing baseball for four years and now plays for the Tigers and BBF South ANC Reading Royals. He plays outfield. Among his other sporting achievements, he lists winning the 25m butterfly for the army cadets in France.

Juan-Carlos Rodrigquez is the youngest Tigers player at 19. He has played in France for Great Britain and for the Golders Green Sox and the Barnestormers. He played infield. Among his claims to fame is winning a break dancing competition on Italian TV.

Julian Dodwell pitches for the Tigers and also plays outfield. Last year he took the National League batting title. He is a Great Britain International and also plays for the Barnestormers. Julian has played on a team in Australia and also, earlier this season, pitched with Brooklyn Dodgers, a New York team.

Harvey Sahker is a Canadian from Toronto. He started playing softball when he was 11 and played for a number of softball teams in Canada before taking up baseball. Playing outfield, Harvey is in his first season with the Tigers and his second with the Croydon Bluejays.

Pete Edwards, infielder, started playing football when he was nine, originally palying for the Wokingham Dukes youth side. He now plays for the ANC Reading Royals and is in his first season with the Tigers. Quite a sprinter, he ran for his county, Berkshire, and still holds the under 16 record for the 100m.

Steve Keeping is originally from Boston, Massachusetts. He began playing at the age of seven, and has played in the States and in Puerto Rico. He is in his third year with the Witham Crusaders in BBF South.
