




THE COMPANY

HOW BASEBALL IS PLAYED

Baseball is played between two teams of nine players. Before the game, each team's manager announces the line-up naming who will play, the order in which they will bat, and their positions in the field. A manager may substitute a player once the game has started, but cannot then reinsert the player whom he has removed.

The team that scores the most runs wins. A run is scored when a player safely crosses home plate after having circled all the bases, often by stopping at each base.

The teams alternate playing offense (batting) and defense (in the field). The visiting team bats first (the top half of the inning) which ends when three of its players are put out.

The home team then bats in the <u>bottom half</u> of the inning. There are <u>nine innings in a game</u>. If the score is even after nine innings, <u>additional innings</u> are played until the tie is broken.

BATTING:

If the batter hits the ball in fair territory (within the 90 degree angle created by the two foul lines) he must try to reach at least first base. If he hits the ball foul (outside the foul lines) he may not run to first base.

A batter is out when he:

- (a) hits the ball in the air and a fielder catches it before it lands (fly out).
- (b) hits the ball on the ground and a fielder throws or carries it to first base before he arrives (ground out).
- (c) is charged with three strikes (strikeout).

A <u>strike</u> is a pitch that passes over home plate without bouncing at a height between the shoulders and knees (<u>strike zone</u>) or that he swings at and misses or hits foul.

Exception: a foul ball when a batter already has two strikes against him is not a strike and the ball is dead as soon as it touches the ground.

A pitch that passes outside the strike zone and is not swung at is a ball. The home plate umpire judges all balls and strikes.

- (d) having already reached base safely, is tagged with the ball by a fielder when he is not touching a base.
- A batter reaches base safely when he:
- (a) receives four balls (a walk or base on balls)
- (b) is hit by a pitched ball
- (c) hits a ball in <u>fair territory</u> that is not caught on the <u>fly</u> and reaches <u>first base</u> before the fielding team can get the ball there (<u>a base hit or single</u>). A player may advance beyond first base on an extra base hit to second (<u>a double</u>), third (<u>tripled</u>), or all the way around the bases to home (<u>home run</u>).

BASERUNNING:

Runners already on base may advance on any batted ball that touches the round. A runner may not, however, advance on any fly ball, fair or foul, that has been caught by a fielder until he first retouches the base. A foul ball that touches the ground is a dead ball.

A runner may advance a base at any time, even when a teammate is batting and has not yet hit the ball (a stolen base).

Since a batter must at least reach first base to hit safely, existing baserunners may be forced to make room for him by moving to the next base on a ground ball. The fielding team may put out any runner if it brings the ball to that base before the runner reaches it, either by touching the base (force out), or tagging the runner. The fielding team may put out two or, on rare occasions, even three runners on one play (double or tripled play).

BASEBALL TERMS

HITTING:

HIT A player hits a fair ball where no one can be put

HOME RUN A hit that enables the batter to round all the bases. A home run when all the bases are occupied by runners is called a GRAND SLAM.

WALK A batter reaches first base after the pitcher throws four balls.

FLYBALL A ball hit high in the air, a <u>POP-UP</u> if hit straight up in the air.

BUNT

The batter purposely sticks his bat out without swinging in order to drop the ball in front of home plate, usually to advance a runner or to surprise the defense.

PINCH HITTER

A substitute hitter.

BASERUNNING:

PICKOFF A pitcher throws to a base and the baserunner is put out before he can get back to it.

STOLEN BASE

A baserunner advances a base during a teammate's turn at bat.

PITCHING:

STRIKE A pitch that is either inside the strike zone or swung at.

BALL A pitch outside the strike zone that the batter does not swing at.

BALK An illegal pitching motion that entitles every baserunner (but not the hitter) to advance one

BULLPEN An area just off the playing field where "relief" pitchers warm up.

FIELDING:

FORCE OUT

A fielder who has the ball touches a base before a runner who must advance to it.

ASSIST A throw to a fellow fielder enabling him to make a putout.

ERROR A fielder's mistake enables a hitter or base runner to advance safely to a base.


DOUBLE PLAY

A single play in which two men are put out.

PUTOUT A player is retired by a fielder

FIELDER'S CHOICE

A fielder tries to put out a baserunner rather than the player who has just hit the ball.

Don't be taken in by their poor position in the League; the Firetes have some time players and will be looking to end their season with a flourish.




