

Iain's baseball debut was as a 10 year old pinch hitter for the Enfield Chiefs in 1977. He has certainly progressed a long way since then, pitching for the Great Britain National Team in 1988.

Tain is regarded by many as the top pitcher in the country and his statistical record certainly backs that up. During the '89 season he pitched 15 games, winning 10 and striking out 80 in 83.6 innings. He is equally productive with the bat hitting .395 and driving in 33 runs with 8 extra base hits (5 doubles, 1 triple, 2 homeruns).

The highlight of Iain's career has to be the Club Championship Final in which he pitched the Spartans to victory and won the 'Most Valuable Player' Award.

UNDERSTANDING BASEBALL

The game of baseball is played between two teams of inne players.

Before the game, each team announces the order in which its starting players will bal and their fielding positions

The objective of the game is to score more runs than the occasing team. A run can only be scored when a player brailly crosses home. plate, having completed the execut of the diamond, touching and often stopping at every base

Since the batter must run towards hist base if he hits a fair balt on the ground, a runner already in occupation of livst base is forced to runtowards second. If there are runners on first and second bases, or # the bases are loaded (runners occupying all three bases) all runners are forced to try to reach the next base

In such a force play, any runner so forced can be put out either by being lagged or more usually by the helding side throwing or carrying the ball to the base to which he is rowing before he arrives there. Occasionally, two outs are made on one hit ball. These double plays most usually occur when two players are forced out at successive. bases. Another common double play occurs when a batter lads to return to his base before the ball is caused and thrown to that base (a force play)

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Assist. A two- to a fellow limiter enobling him to make a pulput

Balk. An itegal pitching motion, entitling all baserunners, but not the hatter, to advance one base

Ball. A pitch which does not enter the strike zone and is not struck by

Base on balls. A batter may proceed to first base after recoving

Bunt. The batter may square around and try to nudge the ball into the inheld usually to a trance a runner or to try to catch the defence.

Double play. A glay in which two players are out out

Effor. A mishelded or badly thrown ball by a helder which allows a runner to acconce or a batter to reach base.

Flyball, A ball his high in the air

Forced out. This occurs when a helder touches with the ball, the base to which the runner is forced to advance.

Grand slam, When a hone run is bit with all three bases occupied by players. Four runs are sciend.

Home run. A ball bit far over the coffield fence entitles the batter to an automatic run, though he and any other runners still have to Irol around the bases

Pitches. There are three basic pitches (a) The Fastball - designed to beat the batter for sheer pace (pitches have been recorded at up to 90 mph) and depending on the gripused the ball can be made to sink or rise in flight. 

Stolen base. A runner advances from one base to another without the ball being hit


Substitution. Any player can be substituted at any time, but once he leaves the game he may not return

Tag. A player is out tagged if a fielder, holding the tait in his hand or glove, louches a base with his body or louches a runner with his hand. or glove which is holding the ball.

Triple play. Only occurs once or twice in a season and occurs when three players are out on a single play is sportacular when it happens.

How To Score

Baseball fans can enjoy baseball summer by keeping score of the game.

The best part about keeping score is that it's easy. All you need is a basic knowledge of baseball's rules. Experts use a simple code, which is based on numbering players by their positions.

Number Players As Follows

1—Pitcher: 2—Catcher; 3—First Baseman; 4—Second Baseman; 5—Third Baseman; 6—Shortstop; 7—Left Fielder; 8—Center Fielder; 9—Right Fielder; DH—Designated Hitter.

Additional Symbols:


IW for intentional walk, L for fine drive, Kc for called out on strikes, B for bunt, and a wavy line indicating a change, either for a new pitcher or batter.

Every time a batter goes to the plate, use the number to indicate how he was retired or how he reached base.

Fielding plays retiring batters or runners also call for use of the numbers. For instance, the batter who grounds out to the shortstop is retired 6-3 in your scoring. If he flies to the right fielder, merely use the figure 9. If it is foul: 9F.






