## INTRODUCTION TO THE GAME

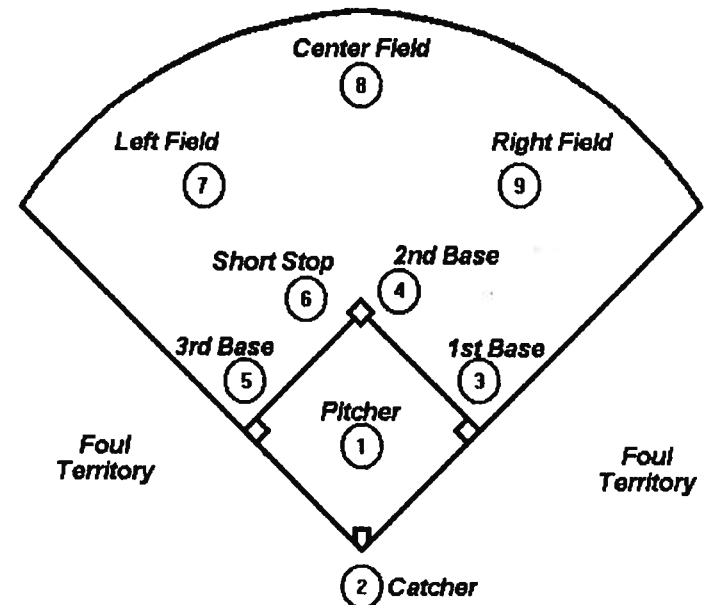
Baseball is played between two teams of nine players. The object of the game is to score more runs than the opposition. A run is scored when a batter advances around all the bases reaching home plate. A run can be scored in stages, in that the batter does not have to get all the way around on one hit. If the batter does get around on one hit, this is called a home run.

A baseball game consists of nine innings, with each team batting nine times. An innings ends when three players of the batting side are out. The batter is allowed three strikes before being called out; on the other hand, four balls allows the batter a 'walk' to first base.

A strike is a pitched ball that passes over the home plate between the batter's knees and armpits. This area is known as the strike zone. A strike will also be called if the batter swings and misses, whatever the location. If the batter hits the ball into foul territory, a strike will also be called, for the first two strikes. Strikes are called by the home plate umpire, who is positioned directly behind the catcher. A ball is called when a pitched ball is out side the strike zone, and the batter does not swing. A fair hit is a batted ball that settles in fair territory in the infield or lands in fair territory in the outfield. If a batted ball is caught on the fly by any fielder the batter is out.

is out if the ball is held on first base before he reaches it. At second base, third base and home plate the runner must be actually tagged with the ball, unless the runners are forced to advance. No base can be occupied by more than one runner, therefore if there is a runner on first base and the batter hits the ball, the runner must run to second base to free first base for the batter. In this situation the fielder does not have to tag the runner: he can just step on the base with the ball in his possession. A base runner does not have to advance to the next base on a hit unless he is forced to by the next runner advancing.

The essence of the game of baseball is the duel between pitcher and batter. The pitcher has to outwit the batter using different pitches, speeds and target locations in the strike zone. The batter's job is to get on base safely, then to attempt to score. Generally the pitcher has the upper hand, with even the best batters only getting fair hits in three out of ten attempts.



A batter must run for first base once he hits the ball; he

## HOW TO KEEP SCORE

- Write the nine names of the batting order (as given by the announcer) in the numbered boxes and each player's fielding position number in the small box to the right. The fielding numbers and positions are: Pitcher (1); Catcher (2); First Baseman (3); Second Baseman (4); Third Baseman (5); Shortstop (6); Left Fielder (7); Centre Fielder (8); Right Fielder (9) (see diagram on previous page).
- When a batter reaches base make the grey line darker in his box and if he advances safely, follow his progress around the bases with further lines in the shape of a diamond. If he scores a run, shade in the diamond.
- When a batter or runner is out, denote the out in his box with a circled number.
- The number across the top of the scoresheet represents the individual innings; so at the end of an inning (when three outs are made), draw a diagonal line in the lower right hand corner of the last batter. When the team comes to bat again, begin with the following batter in the next column.
- If the scores are tied after 9 innings additional innings will be played to find a winner.

## UMPIRE SIGNS

The home-plate umpire behind the batter calls balls and strikes. A strike is indicated with an outstretched right arm. There is usually no indication for a ball. The home-plate umpire will indicate the number of balls and strikes on a batter by using his fingers. Strikes are indicated on the right hand; balls on the left hand. If the count is full (three balls and two strikes) the umpire will clench both fists.

For all umpires, an out is indicated by an upward and downward motion of the right arm. If a runner is called safe, both arms will be extended from the sides.

**Martyn DUTTON #17** narrowly missed being selected for the Atlanta Braves in 1994 after attending their spring training. Martyn lives in Birmingham and has played baseball for 10 years.

**Neil EGGLESTON #2**, another product of the GB youth squads, lives in Nottingham and has played baseball for 10 years.

**Lee EVANS #9**, a rising star from the Hull Mets youth programme, Lee has played baseball for 10 of his 19 years. He has

represented the GB Junior squad for 4 years.

**William JENKINS #21** is in his first year representing GB. Billy is another dedicated player travelling each week from Scotland.

**Alex MALIHOUDIS #7**, at 17 years of age is the youngest member of the squad, but certainly not short on talent or enthusiasm. Alex has spent the last year at College in the States, playing baseball morning, noon and night.

**Andrew MALTBY #10**, the strong silent member of the squad is another product of the Hull youth programme. He has been playing baseball for half of his 24 years.

**Gavin MARSHALL #30**, is another one having spent the last couple of years at college in the States. Gavin lives to play baseball and is following in the footsteps of both his father and grandfather.

**Frank PARKER #28** is the longest serving member of the squad having been there for some 18 years. Following in his father's footsteps Frank has been playing baseball for 28 of his 34 years.

**James PEARCE #20** plays for the London Wolves and has represented GB for 5 years.

**Simon RADGE #23**, another veteran of the squad at the age of 34 has been playing baseball for 19 years in the Hull area.

**Neil READ #15**, another product of the Hull Mets youth programme has been playing baseball for 26 years. This will be his 16th year representing his country.

**Brian THURSTON #24** for many years has terrorised international batters with his blistering battery of pitches. Age 27 Brian is another local player.

**Mark VICKERS #13** is an outstanding shortstop. He has lived for many of his 27 years in Australia.

**Darrin WARD #26** is one of a family of baseballing brothers, having played baseball for over half of his 30 years.

**Andrew WILTSHIRE**, the newest member of the squad, plays for the country's oldest club, Hull Royals. Andy has played baseball for 15 of his 24 years.

**Joseph YARNOLD #19**, the star of the outfield, plays for the Birmingham Bandits. This will be his fourth year representing GB.

# BASEBALL IN GREAT BRITAIN



Baseball in Britain has experienced a chequered past. Baseball has been played in this country since 1874, when a tour of American professionals was held.

The Baseball Association of Great Britain was founded in 1890. It appears that former Boston and Cincinnati player A G Spalding was the driving force behind this development. Spalding, a sports goods manufacturer, offered to finance baseball teams that were associated with any professional football club. However, only four clubs, Derby, Stoke, Preston and Aston Villa took up the offer. Aston Villa were the first champions, but this enterprise was short-lived.

The boom period for British baseball came in the 1930s. In 1933 Sir John Moores of Littlewoods Pools established the National Baseball Association. From 1935-9, he helped to develop leagues all over the country, including Lancashire, Yorkshire, London, Birmingham and South Wales. Many amateur leagues were formed, and from the period 1936-9, professional leagues were developed in both the north of England and the London area. The highlight of this period was the victory by England over the United States in a five-match series. This was acknowledged by the International Baseball Association as the first World Amateur Championships.

The onset of the Second World War restricted the growth of baseball in this country. However the game still remained strong in areas such as Hull, Liverpool, Nottingham and London. Presently the game in Britain is administered by the British Baseball Federation, The showpiece of the game is the Premier Division, which consists of sixteen teams in two divisions:

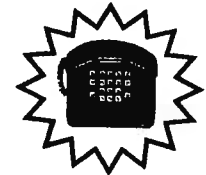

At the end of the regular season, play-offs take place to decide the national champions. Past winners have been 1994 - Humberside Mets, 1995 - Menwith Hill Pirates. The Premier Division is fed by regional leagues based throughout the country, which contain a total of 50 senior teams and 40 junior teams.

Great Britain also competes at international level, with senior (open age) and junior (age 16-18) teams. In 1988 Great Britain won the European B Championships held in Birmingham. In 1993 Great Britain Juniors won the European B Championships in Barcelona.

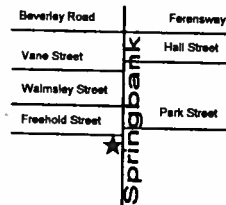
