Instead, this weekend is about celebrating the pinnacle of play in both softball and baseball in this country.

Baseball's postseason began last weekend with nationwide playoffs for the qualifiers from each division to battle for a Final 4 place. For softball this event marks the fruition of our intention to enhance the Nationals with the inclusion of backstops, a PA system, a scoreboard and some spectator seating — and of course, a programme.

Looking ahead, there are number of other events coming up to round off the 2005 season: the 'B' and 'C' Softball Nationals in Keele on September 10–11, the Youth Baseball Final 4 in Bracknell on September 17–18 and the Softball World Series at BA's Concorde Ground also on September 17–18.

Finally, a word of thanks to the Croydon Pirates for hosting the event and for providing a venue that allows us to showcase both sports together. We very much hope you enjoy a great weekend of softball and baseball.
