

#### BACK ON THE BLEACHERS !

At long last season '93 is with us, and the opportunity to enjoy over twenty weeks exciting baseball lies ahead of us all.

Regretably, National League has had to say farewell to Reading Bulldogs, but in their place welcomes Bury Saints and Waltham Forest to bring the Senior Division up to eight. The Buddies League is now the Rookie Division, with teams from Basildon, Bury, Cambridge, London (Barnes) and Tonbridge entered. Rookie Division champs will play Senior Division basement boys in an end of season play-off, and results and league rules permitting, could promote themselves to the Seniors for season '94.

For London Warriors fans (loud cheers from the Linedrive ! editorial and graphics departments), season !93 sees the defence of the '92 championship, which was won in such exciting fashion at Enfield last September, so before looking at today's contest, lets take a look at the championship play-offs for 1992.

#### PLAY-OFF'S 1992

With the top four from the regular season to compete in the championship play-offs, things could not possibly have been tighter. London Warriors and Enfield Spartans tied for first spot on won-lost record, and had to be seperated by the toss of a coin, which gave Enfield the first place tie, and that meant meeting the team in fourth. Well, Birmingham Devils and Croydon Blue Jays were tied for fourth, and had to play off too, the Devils winning through to meet Enfield

Warriors, having been awarded second spot by the fall of a coin, found themselves having to play third placed Cambridge Knights, a side who had shown quite an improvement after the mid-season session with American coaching, having dished out Enfield's first league defeat of the season in late July, and then beating Warriors 8-7 shortly after.

A strong first inning start by the Warriors brought one run in reply by the Knights, only for London's three run lead to be restored in the bottom of the third.

The middle innings were very tight, with neither side prepared to give an inch, and it was with the break of this deadlock in the bottom of the seventh that Warriors began to sense that the finals were in their reach, with two further runs in the eighth finally settling the outcome.

Earlier in the season, Spartans had put a crimp in Warriors style by beating them 10-0 in the league. Despite the fact that both sides had been at the top of the league all season, this first championship game was surprisingly one-sided, with the box score speaking for itself - no contest !

A game saving triple by Darrin Ward, followed by RBI's for Julian Dodwell and Justin Brown put Warriors into a one run lead.

Then a nightmarish start to the bottom of the minth as Enfield's Gary Bedingfield hit a mighty shot off to the left field boundary. The pursueing Warriors fielder, Oliver Heidecker, put both arms into the air, and the fans by the London dugout groaned, presuming a home run, when, in fact it was a ground rule double.

Vincente Martinez pitching, then had a spell of two-out trouble, and with Bedingfield in a scoring position, the tension was unbearable. Finally the third out came, Harry Atwood collecting the ball and throwing to Darrin Ward at first for the out and the championship.

#### LONDON V CAMBRIDGE

# KNOTTY PROBLEMS

In the spring a ball fan's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of....
rules. What was that nagging doubt? What was that point
that needed clarifying? Areas that seemed a bit grey last
summer will seem even greyer after the winter break, and
the season will be under way before actual game situations
provide the stimulus for study. The rules, as pure reading
matter, are not altogether congenial, and it must be said
that some of the approved rulings seem to all but the most
diligent students to confuse rather than clarify.

Baseball's Knotty Problems, edited by Larry Wigge, published by The Sporting News, and available from Sports Pages in London, is exactly what is needed this early in the season, for the editor lists virtually every unusual play that could occur, sets it in a game situation, and provides an explanation in plain English of the official ruling, together with a reference to the appropriate rule. In order to check the official wording one has only to turn to the back of the book, where the complete rules and approved rulings are very neatly and legibly printed.

Fun can be derived from covering the explanations and treating the situations as quiz questions, and the book is enlivened by a number of amusing drawings by Bill Wilson.
