Last season, the London/Enfield clashes were looked forward to with great anticipation, but the first game, at Enfield on June 28th, resulted in a very disappointing performance from London, though of course Enfield were more than happy with a 10-0 slaughter. Still the 7-6 league win for Spartans last season, and the second game of the championship finals, a 5-4 win for Varriors, were very enjoyable, with all the tension good baseball so often causes.

However, Warriors will be smarting after their first defeat of the season last weekend, courtesy of the Cambridge Knights, and they will be determined not to be caught out again.

However, Justin Brown's first plate appearance brought a decisive indication of his intentions, hitting the first of two solo homers for the day. Strong hitting from Harry Atwood, Julian Dodwell and Alan Bloomfield added to the Warrior tally, and by the bottom of the third, it was merely a question of playing the seven innings.

However, full credit to Angels who battled away, trying to find a crack in the Warrior defence. Noel Omechi had an impressive day, his stop and relay of a difficult grounder to third, not only got out the batter, Alan Bloomfield, but also drew applause from the watching crowd. Omechi then produced Angels final flourish in the top of the seventh His well timed swing met Alan Bloomfields pitch beautifully, and the ball sailed down the leftfield line, but unfortunately, rather than a homer, it fell just a few feet foul.


