McDonalds, Mars, Fuji and a host of other kind souls, too humerous to mention, will be pouring inordinate sums of money into this circus to promote a global feeling of sporting brotherhood, whilst enjoying the chance to stick their corporate logos under the noses of some of the biggest television audiences of all time.

Yet somewhere, in camera, but out of focus, just over the shoulders of the dancing girls, and squeezed tantalising between several minutes of all important analysis from former players and managers, there is actually going to be a football match or two taking place.

This highlights the problem of 'successful' sport. Undoubtedly, during the televised soccer orgy now engulfing our screens, we will see some truly great play, but how much of this will have been overshadowed by all the commercialism, the razzmatazz, the gimmicks and the hype ?

When one watches baseball in Britain, there are moments of pure athletic poetry, and you feel that those moments should be captured on film for all time. Just as Ponnie Radford's belting goal for Hereford in the FA Cup is replayed over and over again, and Torvill and Dean's Bolero get's its ninety minth airing, so you would love to see great double plays, spectacular diving catches, and sweetly hit homers given the 'great sporting moments' repeat treatment. But, would we want the distractions that so often come with that kind of exposure? Would we want the dancing girls ? The 'you should clap now' instructional scoreboard? Would we relish PA systems blasting out anthematic pop songs between innings?

The glamour, the hype, the money, the fame. All very nice, but would we remember the games and the players with the same affection that we view them now? Surely their must be a middle ground, where the razznatazz and the human faces and stories of sport meet?

With Harry Atwood and Alan Bloomfield on base, Oliver Heidecker thumped a three run homer for 9-2 Varriors, and a Richard Kemp 2 RBI double concluded a big inning for the Varriors.

Tonbridge then added a further eight runs, highlighted by a 3 run triple for Nick Carter, who finished the day 4 for 5, moving his season batting average to .643. Not content with that, Carter also pitched eight innings, collecting 12 K's.

For the Eagles, hitting highlights came from triples by Dave Reed, (starting pitcher), and a two run triple from Matt Jennings, scoring on a fielding error.

In the remaining National League games, Enfield Spartans demolished Lakenheath Yankees 21-1, whilst the Waltham Forest Angels travelled all the way to Whittlesey to play the Bury Saints, only to find no team awaiting them, and so claim a 9-0 forfeit.

Cambridge Monarchs, a 9-0 forfeit over Gillingham Dodgers lifting Monarchs to 4-1. The winless Reading Royals lost 19-6 to the Bournemouth Bees

BASEBALL GREATS - BUBBER HYDE

Cowan Hyde. Outfield/Second Base. Cincinnati Tigers 1937; Memphis Red Sox 1938-49. Chicago American Giants 1950, Indianapolis Athletics 1951, Elmwood Giants 1951-52, Brandon 1953-54.

One of the Begro Leagues fast line-drive hitters, Pubber was comfortable in the infield or outfield. Hyde was a member of on of the best southern Negro League teams, the Memphis Red Sox of the late 1930's and early 1940's. With the Red Sox Hyde played with pitcher/catcher/manager Double Duty Radcliffe, infielders Marlin Carter, Fred Bankhead and Villie Wells, and pitcher Verdell Mathis. Hyde was named to All-Star squads in 1943 and 1946 and finished his career playing in Canada with Saul Drake and Rayford Finch.
