I've watched and listened to baseball games in a bunch of weird and wonderful settings over the past 50 years, ever since I got the bug as a kid listening to Mel Allen on the New York Yankees radio network while hiding under the covers so my parents wouldn't know I was still awake. That started during the year DiMaggio retired and Mickey Mantle took over for the Yanks in centre field. There's a Todd's Teaser for you: name the year!

It 1975, I caught the seventh game of the World Series on a shortwave radio where sheltering from a thunderstorm in a whitewashed chapel atop the highest hill of the Greek island of Sifnos. Before that, when I first joined the *Pitts-burgh Post-Gazette* as a late-shift reporter, I would get off work at 10 at night and sneak into Forbes Field past abandoned ticket windows to catch the last couple of innings of Pirates games: Clemente, Mazeroski and Stargell working their magic under late-night lights. I've seen baseball in a bunch of dead stadiums: the Kingdome, the Astrodome, Candlestick and the old Memorial Colineum in Cleveland, the "Mistake by the Lake", where I once sold hot dogs to owds so small it took a tracker dog to find the punters. I've caught baseball games on wandering radio signals in countries from France to Nepal.

But to my shame, I've never seen a baseball game in Britain, and that's why I've been looking forward with huge anticipation to this year's Final 4 in Brighton. Not to mention the fact that my job now compels me to explore every nook and cranny of British baseball, just as I've done with British the ball since a friend and I started a famously seminal pick-up game on Hall stead Heath – later to move to Regents Park and never look back – in 1972.

Watching the best four teams in Britain go for the ultimate prize, I'll be hunted by the ghosts of baseball past; but what I've really come to Brighton's manificent ground to see is British baseball's present – and intimations of a glor. us future. I know there will be ballpark hot dogs to weld the past and present together. But can even Skip Murray provide the peanuts and Crackerjacks...?



#### How it could all go wrong

How does any team lose in baseball? They don't play catch, they don't throw strikes and they don't put the ball in play. Although they are the best, baseball is not a sport where you can guarantee a win. For this reason alone, Brighton can be beaten. Part of the joy of watching two baseball teams is the suspense of not knowing for sure what that outcome will be. A pitcher has a bad day, umpire's decision goes against you or another team plays out of their socks, any team can lose.





We shared office space, we shared initiatives and we shared the workload. Development takes time. We are all in a rush to purboth baseball and softball firmly on the sporting map in Britain. There is no doubt about the fact that we are 14,000 members out there pushing for new fields, trying to get sponsors and just aching for more people to play. We took some large steps forward in the beginning of the new Millennium.

our development staff successfully executed the expansion of the *Play Ball!* Program. Young kids were in tating Sammy Sosa and Ken Griffey Jr. up and down the country from Plymouth to Edinburgh with stors along the way for expansion in Birmingham, Bristol, Bracknell, Clacton on Sea, Windsor, Wigan, Hatrogate and Nottingham to name a few. The *Play Ball!* World Series saw more teams involved with more kids screaming their heads off while running the bases, hitting the ball and making diving catches. Battle are won in the trenches. These *Play Ball!* areas are the trenches and our biggest weapons in convincing others at how amazing our game is.

What else was going on? Well, we had three times as many young kids participating on an international level as ever before. We hosted the Kenko Tournament with sponsorship form the Kenko Corporation. Of course the Japanese team won the competition but that was not the most important thing. We all made amazing relations with our Far East friends. Importantly, they showed us a few things about life, playing baseball and deep respect for both opponents and officials. Oh, they were pretty good.

Cur inst ever Easter Baseball Camp was a huge success with over 30 kids participating. The 6th annual Cadet camp also saw an amazing turn out with over 50 kids participating over the course of the week. Next on the expansion of the camps will be our first ever Christmas Camp. Keep an eye out for information.

The Frank Caunce Memorial Youth Tournament had over 500 people on the day witness the becompetition we've ever had. Over 350 kids took part in the schools, Bronco, Pony competitions are ball clinic. In, and as usual, the weather was amazing. It was the best day of the summer.

Our domestic youth competitions are nearly over with just our All-Star competitions at the Final 4 for both Pony and Bronco divisions and the Pony National Finals on the 9th of September to go. Again, many of these players will be graduating onto senior teams for 2001.

Finally, this weekend's games signal an end to our senior domestic competition. The Knockout Cup pits North Vs South when Yorkshire take on Richmond in a fight for Division One supremacy. In the Premier Division, our national final is taking place. There are four able teams fighting it out for the right to be called National Champions. In the first Semi-final, old rivals, London Warriors (??-2) take on the Menwith rid! Patriots (29-3). In part two of Semi-final Saturday, 1999 National Champions Brighton (19-1?) take on Preston (27-5). On Sunday, the Semi-final winners will fight it out for the right to be called Champs. Adds are that this will be the most competitive baseball weekend in British Baseball history.


